Some hints to help prevent damage to cymbidium orchid plants on extreme heat days

In Adelaide, South Australia, during January 2019, we experienced a very long, hot, dry spell, with temperatures over thirty five degrees centigrade (95 degrees F), and peaking at forty six degrees centigrade (115 degrees F), on one day. Added to this were strong hot winds.

Some members experienced horrific burning of their plants (see photos on following pages). One grower reports about 75% of his plants were torched, with many, many fatalities, particularly among smaller plants. It should be noted that one grower lives quite near the sea, where he regularly experiences very strong, salt laden winds.

Other growers have reported, very little burning of their plants.

At the February meeting, we will be holding a short forum, where we will seek input from anyone willing to share their experiences in this area. Come along and participate. If you have any equipment which you use to help, bring it with you if you can, or take a photograph of it, and put it onto an electronic memory stick, and bring it to the meeting, or email it to me, before the meeting (gramorris@optusnet.com.au).

From investigations, so far, those who suffered little or no damage, watered or fogged their plants regularly during the hot spells. I heard from one grower who watered his plants four times during the day and experienced no burning.

Another watered his plants just twice (at 7am, and 10pm), but had his foggers operating for 10 seconds, every 10 minutes from 11am until 7pm. He suffered no burning.

I personally watered 3 times during the day, at 10.30am, 12.30pm, and 3.00pm, for about 6 minutes each watering. I have no foggers fitted at the moment, but will fit them soon. I experienced no burning. (see photos on following pages.

Most of the badly affected growers, did not water of fog their plants during the hot days. They did have the plants well hydrated, at the start of the hot days.

It needs to be noted, that a good automatic watering system, which is easy to reset to water for extreme days, is almost a must. They are not expensive, and are relatively easy to program, and importantly to reprogram for hot times. There are plenty around for well less than \$100. Installing one might save much more than that on the first very hot day. Modern timers are very reliable, if installed correctly.

Come along to the February meeting, and learn more.

(Editor's Note)

This plant is claimed by many to be a peloric form of this popular species cymbidium. Other experts do not agree with this rating, rather suggesting it is a really interesting form.

There are many mottled forms, and many very dark2(almost black) forms. Could be this be a natural hybrid from a mottled and dark form??
