





In the next few pages of this magazine you should learn a lot more about it.




Khanebono family tree from OrchidWiz Below is the breakdown of the species cymbidiums in Khanebono's breeding See this information in colour on your computer (it is much better)







Glenn tells me that he has homes for most of the plants remaining at the end of this flowering season.


