In the past, very few FCC's have ever been awarded to cymbidiums. There were no FCC's awarded at the Festival, but a couple got close. A photo has now surfaced of a first flowering seedling, which was not shown this year. Many experts are tipping this plant will win an FCC soon.

The plant is Regal Princess 'Perfection'.

A photograph of it will be shown at the October meeting. It will be interesting to hear what our members think of it.

There were 8 awards in total

For the less experienced growers, there are three quality awards.

When judged out of 100 points if a plant receives

1. Between 75 and 79.9 points it receives a **Highly Commended Certificate (HCC)**
2. Between 80 and 84.9 points, and it receives an **Award Of Merit (AM)**
3. If it receives over 85 points, it receives **First Class Certificate (FCC)**. Very few of these have ever been awarded

There are also special awards for **Outstanding Culture**, an **Award of Distinction (AD)**, and a **Special Medal from OSCOV**

There were three **Awards of Merit (AM)** awarded

There were five **Highly Commended Certificates** awarded

There was one **Outstanding Culture Certificate** awarded

One plant was awarded a Highly Commended Certificate, and an Award Of Distinction. It also won the prestigious **Orchid Societies Council of Victoria (OSCOV)) Medal**.

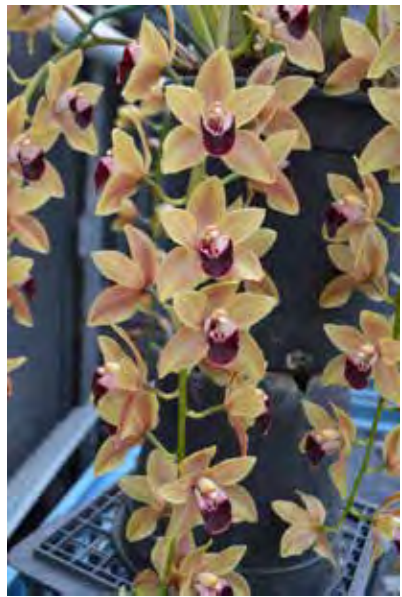

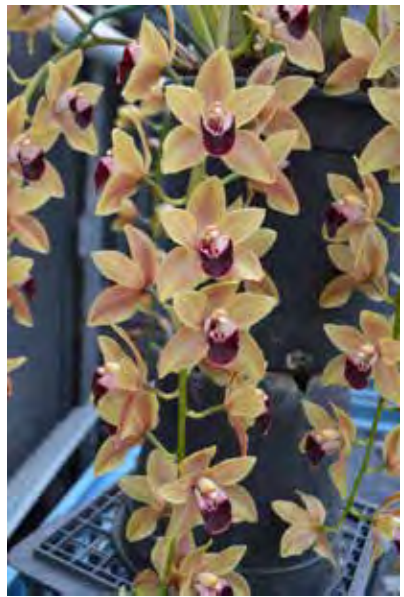

## Details of awards given at the Victorian Cymbidium Orchid Festival

Kimberley Flash 'Skyla' received an Award of Merit with 83 points

hookerianum received an Outstanding Culture Certificate

Regal Princess 'Bernice' received an Award of Merit with 82 points

goeringii 'Benimaro' received a Highly Commended Certificate with 79 points

Laramie Joy x Kimberley Winter received a Highly Commended Certificate with 78.7 points

Khan Flame 'Neroli' received an Award of Merit with 83 points

Spotted Madam 'Brydie' received a Highly Commended Certificate with 76.4 points, **and** an Award Of Distinction. It also received the OSCOV Medal, as the most eyecatching cymbidium in the show.

The quality of the flowers in this show was outstanding, with one very meritorious, world rated Judge stating that there were number of plants which he considered were worthy of being considered for the highest award of the First Class Certificate. It is many years since there has been one of these given. Two plants were just 2 points away from winning a FCC. Surely we must see one of these soon. Do the Judges need to be more proactive?

Perhaps these awards will give a good benchmark for future Judging sessions.

Single Flower Competition

At each meeting this year, we will be promoting a single flower competition. We love you to bring your whole plant in flower to exhibit, but there are many reasons why this may not be possible. If this is the case, take this opportunity to show off your single flowers. Please ensure the plant name is on a card, and if possible add a short description of the plant. For example indicate how many flowers per spike, plant size and how many flower spikes, or any other points of interest. Flowers exhibited should be collected after the meeting by the exhibitor. If not possible, please arrange an alternative arrangement with the judges when presenting your flowers for judging. Flowers not collected will be destroyed.

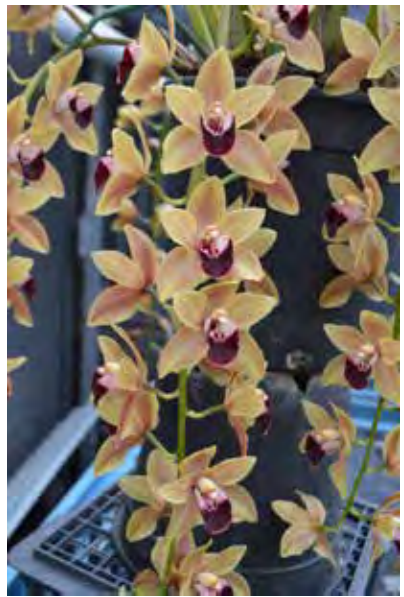
