**Trisodium phosphate (TSP)** has long been used by many of our members to sterilize tools and anything coming into contact with cut surfaces of our orchids, to prevent the spread of various forms of orchid virus. In the past it has been available through our Trading Table. **However, only a small amount has been sold in recent times, AND the price has increased substantially.**

It is a good time to point out that we all must do all possible to prevent the spread of virus in our collections. I hear reports of members using bleach or methylated spirits, to sterilize their tools. If you are using these methods, or worse still, not sterilizing your instruments at all, **your orchid collection is at risk.**

Wikipedia (a free online Encyclopedia) describes TSP as follows

“**Trisodium phosphate (TSP)** is the inorganic compound with the chemical formula  $\text{Na}_3\text{PO}_4$ . It is a white, granular or crystalline solid, highly soluble in water producing an alkaline solution. TSPs are used as cleaning agent, lubricant, food additive, stain remover and degreaser”

If you are not using TSP, you should consider using it. The Club has purchased a large bag of it and will sell smaller quantities through the trading table. Instructions on how best to use it will be supplied. It is actually easier to use than many other sterilizers, and does not corrode instruments as does bleach.

When using TSP, a saturated solution (in water) is required. Around 120 grams of TSP in a litre of water makes a saturated solution, but more (or less) may be required, depending on the temperature. The solution is good for use for many months, depending on how much it is used. If stored in a sealed container between uses, it does not evaporate. It keeps in good condition for many months. If you pre wash tools, to eliminate foreign bodies on the tools, it lasts much longer. It needs replacing, when the solution turns a pale purple/lilac colour. Soak tools for at least 20 minutes in the solution, before re using..

An alternative to TSP is Sugar Soap (saturated solution) or Tricleanium Ultra concentrated Cleaner. These are both available from good hardware stores. Liquid Sugar Soap concentrate is available at Bunnings for \$1.99 for a litre. Tricleanium (powder) is also available from Bunnings, in various sizes. A 2.2Kg canister is \$26.32. A saturated solution requires about 100 grams per litre, again depending on the temperature.

Full cream milk will also sterilize your cutting tools. Again at least 20 minutes soaking ~~is~~ required before re using tools. Hint, milk needs discarding each day after use. **Don't drink it after using it.**





### Another hint

Collect a good number of scissors, and sharp knives and store them in a seal-able container.

Taller screw cap plastic containers, are great for taller knives LHS photo below

Two litre round yoghurt containers are excellent for scissors RHS below

Wash instruments in a tub like one below the yoghurt container, before inserting into sterilizer



When we visited Terry Poulton at his home, a good number of visitors from South Australia, and Western Australia, were shown around, and offered some growing advice from Terry.

The plants in his growing house were amazing, obviously growing very, very well, with hundreds of big (huge) flower spikes. Even more amazing, was that Terry had a large display, of his best plants at the show, at the same time.

## **Terry's Growing Instructions**

### **Growing Mix**

30 litres of Coir Fibre

15 litres of Perlite (Coarse Grade)

Mix with one cup of Terry's SHS (Secret Herbs & Spices)

Mix thoroughly, wet it well so all of SHS coats the Coir. Can be used immediately, but better if stored for at least two days.

### **SHS formula**

Two parts of Dolomite, two parts of Gypsum, One part of Garden Lime, One part of Superphosphate. Mix it well

### **Usage for a 7" diameter Pot**

20ml heaped spoon, 70/75mm from top

plus 10mm of 12 month slow release

and 10mm of three to four month slow release

70/75mm from top
