



The March Flower of the Night was a nicely grown plant of Ausie Dreamtime Grown by Roger Herraman

It was growing well, in a 170mm (7 inch) pot, with 4 flower spikes open, and one in bud.

The flowers were light brown in colour, tending to red in the centre, and complimented by a dark red lip.

The breeding is Golden Elf x canaliculatum 25% ensifolium, 50% canaliculatum (both Species cymbidiums) It was commented on that the bright golden yellow from Golden Elf did not appear to come through.

Also interesting in that canaliculatum flowers late in the season. Golden Elf, flowers early in the season. This plant has flowered near mid way between the two parent plants. Sometimes this type of breeding produces prodgeny which flower in June or July, also midway, but the long way round.

There will be no Single Flower Competition this month (May to October only)


