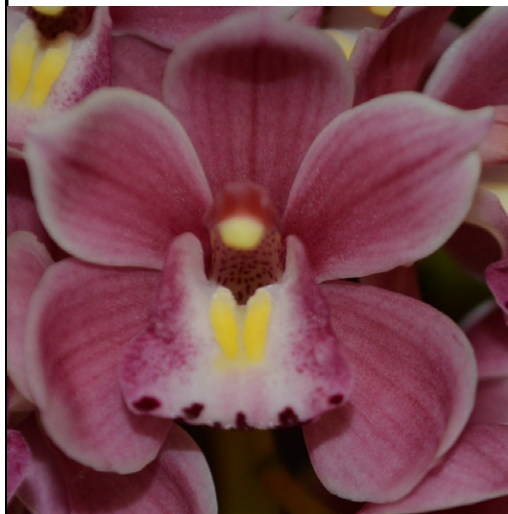

**This is the flowering version of the plant which was at the last meeting,
with all the flower spikes.**

While researching to do a presentation at another Orchid Club recently, I was surprised to find that one breeding plant was the parent of a large number of the best plants winning major prizes on the showbench today. I used the fabulous Orchid database OrchidWiz X4.0a (a bit out of date) to obtain the following information. I will call it at this stage, a **Mystery Plant**.

See if you can identify it before I reveal it's name later in this article

This plant had 46 direct offspring at that time. It had 356 total progeny. The plants listed below are just some that I am familiar with, but are really important breeding and showbench clones.

There were other Cronulla clones of high quality. Bryant Orchids did breed with other varieties with good success.

I personally grew a flask of Cronulla seedlings to flowering size, with a number of good ones resulting. I flowered one and exhibited at the Winter Show of the Orchid Club of South Australia, and it won Champion seedling and Champion Cymbidium, on it's first flowering.

It was a really good grower, pale yellow in colour, with good shape. It was particularly long lasting, and flowers regularly lasted for 4 months in good condition.

If you look at the breeding you will see Alvin Bryant as one parent, which had White Christmas and the Tetraploid converted Fanfare as it's parents.

The other parent Luningrad 'Elanora' was another plant which was converted to tetraploid form, from it's original diploid state. Both Fanfare and Luningrad were big green standard flowers.

The White Christmas has the famous Early Bird 'Pacific' and Stanley Fouraker as it's parents. Both were top quality crisp white standards.

I found it interesting in that pinks and pastel yellow colours came through from breeding dominated by greens and whites.

Alvin Bryant was the hybridizer of Cronulla

Cronulla as a breeder has been amazingly successful with some great plants from primary matings, but even more successful in future generations.

Many members will be aware that there was a magazine being produced by Geoff Bailey, the former Editor of the Australian Cymbidium Scene (no longer in production).

After Geoff stopped producing ACS, he started the on line magazine called **Cymbidium Chatter**. The new magazine is only available in electronic format.

Geoff recently handed over production to Joshua White, a relatively young grower, based in Melbourne. Joshua is a extremely competent computer programmer, and very knowledgeable cymbidium expert. He now also manages the Cymbidium Orchid Society of Victoria web site.

Cymbidium Chatter is a really great magazine, and gives lots of information and photos from Australia, and overseas. There was an edition posted in February 2021, and it is intended to be published every two months.

Check it out. Really good reading

In the February edition there is notification that due to racist connotations, the plant name for the Cymbidium **Little Black Sambo**, has been renamed to **Helen Bannerman**

There is a well known variety Little Black Sambo "Black Magic" (very dark, almost black mini), which should now be labelled Helen Banneman 'Black Magic'

Interesting, there are now other pale and pure colour versions of LBS available, now to be called Helen Banneman
