Born in Melbourne, and came to Adelaide as State Manager for SC Johnson in 1980 and lived in Glenalta for 15 years. Had an 11 year stint back in Melbourne after being re-

trenched, and lived in Gisborne, a semi rural town 50km out of Melbourne on the Bendigo Freeway.

Returned to Adelaide, living in Glenelg North for the past 10 years

Most of my working life was in the grocery industry, with 40 year in senior management roles with some major international companies, Johnson & Johnson, SC Johnson, Mauri Foods, Network Foods, and the last ten years before retirement with Barilla the Italian Food company, as National Sales manager.

My introduction to orchids came from my father who was a member of the Frankston Orchid Club in Melbourne. Although we were living in Adelaide, it was great to see his passion, and I guess some of it rubbed off on me. Unfortunately he was not a good grower and only had a very small back yard with no light, and struggled to get his plants to flower.

My father died in 1987 at 69, and I inherited most of his plants, which I brought back to Adelaide, and not knowing what I was doing slowly killed most of them. I had a few flower and as one died, I went down to the old Valley Nursery in Morphett Vale, and replaced them with whatever was on special at the time, but still didn't have a clue to what I was doing. When we went to Gisborne I took the remaining 30+ plants with me. We lived on 5 acres, and built a house with a large shed, to which I attached a shade house at the end, facing north. Gisborne's weather was warm in summer, but with snow and frost and freezing winters, and not enough water and never feeding them, they all died.

We returned to Adelaide in 2006 as our grandchildren were being born and we wanted to return home and grow old gracefully with the grand kids and our sons. One son remained behind, as he had married a Melbourne girl and produced 2children.

I still did not have clue on what I was doing, and brought a tray of twenty plants on EBay. Another mistake as 12 out of the twenty have died, even though by this time I knew what I was doing, and here we are six years later, it looks like I will get my first flowers from two of the plants this year. The rest have been warned "no flowers this years and it's the green bin lor you".

Fortunately my next purchases on EBay were from Chee Ng, who I formed a friend-ship with, and he starting pointing me in the right direction on how to grow Cymbidiums, and kept telling me to join the club. I also brought some plants from Graham Morris towards the end of his time at Valley Orchids and like Chee, we formed a friendship, and he also helped me in what I should be doing to be successful in growing Cymbidiums. He also told me I should join the club.

I finally joined the club after much pressure from the two of them and here we are six years later, thanks to Chee and Graham, four shade houses, hundreds of plants, on the Committee for the past three years, editor of the Cymbidium News for the past two years, and now President of the club. The only thing I can say is, watch what you buy on EBay, or you could end up with a smaller back yard, a wife that does not want me to take up any more space, and time management up in smoke.

The good part is you wouldn't do it if you didn't love what you are doing. You love the plants you grow, you enjoy the company of club members and making new friendships, which all in all makes retirement far better than working.


