Welcome to our August issue,

No plants for showing this month as the West Lakes show is only three days later. Glenn Heyland from Easy Orchids will be our guest speaker, so we can look forward to a good meeting if everything things stays as it is.

As there was no meeting in July, we decided to judge the plants in the display at Port Adelaide. Many thanks to our Register of Judges, Chee Ng and the Judges for a difficult job well done. The following growers were the winners for the month, Open division was won by Chee Ng with a first time flowering seedling Anna

Dragon x Blazing Pepper. First division winner was Graham Fear with Coraki Glowing 'Kentlyn' and Second Division best was Greg Wallace with Sundaani Dream 'Orange Crush'. Chee's Anna Dragon x Blazing Pepper was Flower of the Night.

The Port Adelaide display and Trading table was again a huge success. Many thanks to John and Craig for being there every morning at 7.00am until 9.00pm, also everybody else who helped on the trading table, or helped with the judging and display erection on the Wednesday night.

Just under 300 plants were sold in the three days, with the last few going at 3.30pm on the Saturday. This is about the same result as at Munno Para, and has given all growers and the club a great result so far this year, with the West Lakes show still to come.

The West Lakes Spring show, displays and trading table will be from Saturday 28th August with the show put in from 5.30pm, (not before) with parking outside the Woolworths (western) entrance. The trading table will run from Sunday 29th until Saturday 4th September at 5.00pm. Judging and the display's will be in the centre court area and the Trading Table in the usual spot next to the Cross-Lotto kiosk.

There will be a 22 plant trading table limit (one page of the selling page) for each member for a start on the Saturday night. You can bring extra plants, but they will go into storage and as the sales go on, these will be brought out and placed on the table. This is to give all members an equal chance to sell their plants on the first few days. We will need as many plants as we can get, because last year we sold out with a day and a half to go, and with Sunday 5th being Father's Day this will also help plant sales, so bring them in right through the week.

Fertilizing was discussed, including the benefits of having a meter to test the fertilizer levels being applies (an EC meter). A number of plants were observed and discussed, including many seedlings flowering for the first time.

At the commercial nursery (Jong's Nursery), the various stages of were observed and discussed, and the participants had the opportunity to purchase some really good quality plants, at good prices. These members will benefit from this outing.

West Lakes Spring Show Sunday 29th August to Saturday 4th September 2021

Entry is via the western end loading dock as per last year next to Woolworths. Park opposite the Lakes Hotel and the entrance is through the large iron gates.

Helpers during the week can get a free parking ticket from the Trading Table or Wayne Baylis

Doors will be open at 5 00 pm Saturday 28th August for put in of plants.

Put in is from 5 00 pm— 5 45 pm. Judging starts at 6.00pm.

All displays to be completed and fenced by 10.30pm.

Any person with plants for displays, but not for judging, may place them in any of the display areas.

For judging of all divisions (Open, First and Second), signs will be posted in the best lighted areas, indicating where to place each category of plant. If you are doubtful about where to place a plant, get help from a judge, or place it where you think it should go, and if incorrect, the judges will move it to the correct area.

Measurements are horizontally across the widest part of the flower.

All plants for judging or for sale on the trading table, must be clean, and not showing signs of virus, or the Judges or Show Marshal will reject them. The Judge's decisions are final. Should any protest be lodged, the Show Marshal will call an expert panel to give a decision.

Name tags are to be firmly attached to all plants exhibited. (available from the Registrar of Judges)

Open Division - Green, First Division - Buff, Second Division - White

The name of the plant is to be neatly written, and the Exhibitor Number in the bottom right hand corner

If the plant is a first time flowering seedling a yellow dot is to be attached to the label (available from Registrar)

After judging, a blue dot attached to the label indicates a first prize has been won by that plant. A red dot indicates a second prize, and a green dot indicates a third prize. Plants can win prizes in more than one class.

Note also. No plants will be judged at the monthly meeting night (Wednesday August 26th). Bring them all to West Lakes.

Many growers, particularly beginners, but also many more experienced growers, have difficulty understanding the terms diploid, triploid, and tetraploid when talking about cymbidiums.

Going back over 100 years, most cymbidiums grown were species cymbidiums, not long after being removed from growing wild in forests.

Their shape was very poor by today's standards.

Hybridizers started breeding these species plants, but in first generations, most of the first progeny from these species plants, still lacked good shape.

There was one plant which when it flowered was a big improvement on most other sibling plants. It's name was Alexanderi 'Westonbirt', often referred to as AWB. It won prizes and was highly awarded. Obviously, because it was so much better than all other plants around at the time, it was bred extensively. Most of it's babies were better shape than most of the plants around, but not as good as this super plant AWB. When AWB's progeny were used for breeding, most did not set seedpods. They were generally sterile. Eventually they discovered that the old species plants had 40 chromosones, set out in 2 pairs of 20 chromosones (2N). AWB was discovered to have 80 chromosones, 4 pairs of 20 chromosones. When the 4N AWB was bred with any 2N mating, the babies had 60 chromosones, or 3 sets of 20 chromosones. In nature, most things with an uneven setting of chromosones, are sterile.

Nowadays we can convert very small plants (during tissue culture) from 2N to 4N, by treating the small protocorms produced in early stages of the tissue culture process, with a chemical. Colchacine was used, in years back, but now Oryzalin is used. These chemicals only convert a percentage of the plants after treatment. Plants converted from 2n to 4N, have hastened the development of top quality, shapely cymbidiums.

Occasionally a plant just changes from 2N to 4N, during the cloning proceed. A 4N version of a previous 2N variety is bigger than the 2N form. It is double the volume. We see it as about 30% bigger, but thicker in the petals.

Nowadays most standard sized plants are tetraploid (4N). Many miniatures are still diploid (2N)
