

A little more about the late Ben Knobben

Ben has been a member of our club, since the late 1980's.

On the next page is the eulogy, given by our President, Graham Fear, at Ben's funeral service on Friday 4th February where he gave a summary of Ben's service to our club.

Ben's wife Christine, also provided some information about Ben.

Ben's Daughter Jo, gave a really nice eulogy at the service. In it we learned a lot more about this amazing man.

Ben was 79 years old when he passed away. He was born in Holland, and migrated to Australia, when he was aged fourteen

Over the last couple of years, he suffered badly from cancer of the esophagus, and underwent two huge operations, the first in late December, and the second one a couple of weeks later. Normally someone of Ben's age would not have been offered these procedures. It was only that Ben was extremely fit, through his love of kayaking, and him doing a couple of hours on the water, most days. Besides being an extremely good cymbidium grower, Ben was an exceptionally good artist, specializing in painting scenes on the water. One of his paintings was bought along to the funeral service. It was a high quality painting of waves and surf.

Ben was also a very good guitarist, and was a very good vocalist. He had a regular singing gig, each Sunday evening. I am told he had a very good singing voice.

Some years back, Ben told me that he was studying Reflexology, where he could apply pressure to specific points of the body, to relieve pain. He was in demand to help people who knew about this gift, but was very selective in who he offered his services to.

Rest in peace Ben.

Sale of the Ben Knobben cymbidium Orchid Collection, Sunday 6th March from 10.00am

Ben assembled a very good cymbidium orchid collection.

He had about 200 flowering plants. A large percentage are plants which he grew as seedlings. He only kept high quality clones, and disposed of any which were not up to his high quality expectations. There are a few high quality named clones, sourced from various commercial nurseries.

Our club has offered to find new homes for them all, to assist Christine, Ben's wife.

The club has produced a list of the plants, and has taken photographs of all of them. Unfortunately, photos of the flowers are not readily available. Check our previous magazines

The list will be available at the February meeting.

Members with email addresses given to the club, will be emailed the list, which will include the colour photographs of the plants.

An auction of plants and growing equipment will be conducted at Ben's house, in Kidman Park, on Sunday 6th March, from 10.00am. Viewing of the plants is from 9.30am (and not a minute before.)

Credit card facilities will be available to avoid bringing cash.

Below is the eulogy given by our President, Graham Fear at Ben Knobben's funeral service

Ben Knobben

Hello, my name is Graham Fear, and I am the president of the Cymbidium Orchid Club of South Australia.

One of Bens great loves in life was growing Cymbidium orchids. He joined the Cymbidium Orchid Club of South Australia in the late eighties, and has been a continuous member for well over thirty years. He was also a member of The South Australian Orchidaceous Society.

Ben grew excellent cymbidiums, winning many major prizes over the years. He was also a Committee Member, Show Judge, National Show Committee Member, Registrar of Judges and a Life Member,

But most of all he was just Ben, always happy to help in any way, point anyone in the right direction on how to grow their plants, give a plant or two to somebody, or just, have you tried this. I'm having great success with it.

Before illness caught up with him, Ben started running new judges training courses with Max Kahlbaum, which has resulted in six new Cymbidium judges for the club. When he resigned from the position of Registrar of Judges, one of these new judges has taken over from Ben, which is a credit to him and Max for their training course.

Always first to help, he organized the SAROC fair display each year. The only thing he wasn't there for was when we had a change a of day for the West Lakes Show from a Saturday night to a Sunday night one year. Ben said apologetically, "I'm very sorry, I can't be there as I have permeant singing date on Sunday nights". Ever the loyal man, and I didn't know he could sing, let alone have a permanent gig.

With Bens passing, we posted the news on our Facebook page, and another cymbidium growers page. Together they have had over two and half thousand people viewed his post, and 200 have interacted or commented on it.

Ben will be sorely missed by everybody in the South Australia Orchid Family, especially the members of the Cymbidium Club. I will leave you today with a posting from the other side of the world from one of the major cymbidium growers in the world, which describes Ben perfectly

From Andy Easton (From Columbia, South America) A very important figure who contributed tirelessly to his Cymbidium club Rest in Peace Ben.

Beware

We recently heard about bad advice given to a member about watering their plants during summer.

The advice given by someone claiming to be an orchid growing expert was to water their plants

ONCE A WEEK OVER SUMMER

Fortunately we were able to give good advice, before too much damage was done

Just for the record, most growers water their plants AT LEAST every second day, most, every day

I personally water mine twice a day for 6 minutes, most of the summer period

During extreme hot periods, I water early overnight, or early morning in addition, so that plants are not burned.

A few years back when we did have many days of extreme heat, those growers not having their plants well hydrated by early morning, suffered lots of burning and plant losses

Growers who had plants well hydrated by early morning suffered little damage 8

Ask other experienced members if you are in doubt

This means you must plan and purchase plants by January to be able to exhibit them in the Winter Show, and by February for the Spring Show

You are able to display plants not owned for six months or more, but you must mark them as not for competition.

We are always looking for good quality plants in our displays, so you are encouraged to display them even if you do not enter them competitively.

The same rule applies to showing plants at monthly meetings, so keep good records of purchase date.
