

Presidents Message February 2024

You don't want you whole collection becoming infected, so don't take any chances and remove to isolation any suspect pants. Scrutinize the new growths for any signs of virus. We have just received another 100 virus kits from Barritta Orchids, and they will be available at the February meeting.

Remember though that they are no good on Fleck virus, so make sure you know what Fleck Virus looks like, and if unsure dispose, or isolate it and seek the opinion of an experienced grower. (bring a leaf, wrapped in plastic to a meeting and ask for an opinion)

We are still arranging our entertainment and guest speakers' program for this year, with a few already locked in and we will advise the program as soon as we get confirmations.

I hopefully look forward to seeing you all on Wednesday the 28th.

Kevin was a longtime Judge and supporter of the Cymbidium Orchid Club of South Australia, and was a all round good bloke.



Are you having difficulty with weeds growing in your cymbidium orchid pots?

There are a number of really annoying weeds regularly seen in the pots. One particular nasty one, Oxalis, a tiny clover type weed, is seen in many plants in many collections. It is difficult to pull out. Often it breaks off and the root system reshoots soon after. It often grows between the backbulbs, in the middle of the plant, making it very difficult to remove.

However, there is an easy way to get rid of this pest, and most other weeds. LINURON DF is used successfully by many growers. It is relatively safe to spray on the leaves of our cymbidiums. I find it better to mix it in a small hand spray bottle, and squirt the weeds in the pot. With a little practice it is possible to just hit the weed, with very little spray reaching the orchid plant. The plant (and weed) should not watered (or rained upon) for about 24 hours. It might take up to a week for the weeds to perish. It is a very easy and effective way to control weeds in your collection. Beware, other plants (lettuce, and many soft flower plants) must be protected from any spray drift.

It is only available commercially in large packets. When I enquired to get more recently, I was told that it was only available in 10kg boxes, costing \$800+. After more enquiries, I did source some in 2kg packets, for a little over \$200. Packets this size would treat a huge amount of plants for a long time.

We have purchased a box and repackaged into 100 gram bags, which will be available from our trading table, for \$12. This amount will be enough for a smallish private collection for a long time, probably at least a couple of years. I mix 4 grams of Linuron in 1 litre of water in a hand held spray bottle. With a little practice, you can walk through your orchid plants and target the weeds, barely touching the orchid plants.

I will bring a hand spray to the beginner's meeting for the February meeting, and demonstrate how easy it is to do. It is much easier and more effective than pulling weeds out. Give it a go and take control of weeds in your collection.

Below is a brief description of it. There is a huge amount of information about it on the net. You will have difficulty in finding dosage rates for our cymbidiums. Manufacturers are very wary of recommending the use of products like this, without thoroughly testing it on a particular plant. It is expensive to do so. It might not have been tested by the manufacturer on cymbidiums, but it has been used extensively by commercial growers for many, many years. Give it a try on a few plants before using it on your whole collection.

Linuron (3- (3,4-dichlorophenyl)-1-methoxy-1-methylurea) is a **phenylurea herbicide** that is used to control the growth of grass and weeds for the pulpose of supporting the growth of crops like soybeans.

This new product is getting good reviews from growers everywhere who have been using it for some time. Rodents cause lots of damage if not controlled. Be prepared. Have some on hand.

First release ever. An amazingly eyecatching spotted cymbidium **Spotted Madam 'Brydie'** AD COCSA, AD & HCC COSV

Flowering sized plants growing strongly in a 17cm (7 inch) pot will be available at our February meeting.

They should flower in the 2024 season.

It will be released nationally soon (as soon as it is safe to post plants), and is likely to be very sought after, and possibly hard to source later in the year.

It is a diploid, and the shape is not big and round, but it is amazingly eyecatching, and will be highly sought after. Get one (or two) now.



When it first flowered in a 17cm pot, it produced 6 flower spikes, with 3 spikes having 13 flowers each, and 3 spikes with 8 flowers each (see photo below) It was awarded an AD at our Spring Show in 2016, also at the Victorian Spring Show an AD and a HCC, the same year.

It was highly sought after by interstate enthusiasts at the time, with a number of high priced offers to buy the plant.

Unfortunately it took some time to get tissue excised to clone it.

It is a very good grower, and has produced multiple flower spikes in the last 2 years, growing in 10cm (4 inch) pots. Very limited numbers are available.

Genuine flowering sized plants for sale, in 17cm (7 inch) pots. \$50 each. (cash) Buy 2 and get a bonus small plant.

Spikes usually are late season showing. Plants in spike when available will be \$75 each.
