West Lakes Spring Show Sunday 28th August to Saturday 3rd September 2022

Entry is via the western end loading dock as per last year next to Woolworths. Park opposite the Lakes Hotel and the entrance is through the large iron gates.

Helpers during the week can get a free parking ticket from the Trading Table or Wayne Baylis

Doors will be open at 5 00 pm Saturday 28th August for put in of plants.

Put in is from 5 00 pm— 5 45 pm. Judging starts at 6.00pm.

All displays to be completed and fenced by 10.30pm.

Any person with plants for displays, but not for judging, may place them in any of the display areas.

For judging of all divisions (Open, First and Second), signs will be posted in the best lighted areas, indicating where to place each category of plant. If you are doubtful about where to place a plant, get help from a judge, or place it where you think it should go, and if incorrect, the judges will move it to the correct area.

All plants for judging or for sale on the trading table, must be clean, and not showing signs of virus, or the Judges or Show Marshal will reject them. The Judge's decisions are final. Should any protest be lodged, the Show Marshal will call an expert panel to give a decision.

Name tags are to be firmly attached to all plants exhibited. (available from the Registrar of Judges)

Open Division - Green, First Division - Buff, Second Division - White

The name of the plant is to be neatly written, and the Exhibitor Number in the bottom right hand corner

If the plant is a first time flowering seedling a yellow dot is to be attached to the label (available from Registrar)

After judging, a blue dot attached to the label indicates a first prize has been won by that plant. A red dot indicates a second prize, and a green dot indicates a third prize. Plants can win prizes in more than one class.

Any member who has foliage plants or gadgets etc which could be used in the displays, is asked to bring them along on put in night. Extra and interesting items can brighten a display.

Note also. No plants will be judged at the monthly meeting night (Wednesday August 24th). Bring them all to West Lakes.



June Meeting 2022 Species cymbidium hookerianum

After using the photo above in the July magazine, I received an email (below) from a very knowledgeable grower from Victoria, Joshua White.

In the July issue of *Cymbidium News*, there was a photo of Mike Gray's "hookerianum" which is very likely to be Cym. Rosefieldense (is not, it is another *Cym. hookerianum* hybrid). *Cym. hookerianum*, even the "punctatum" form (which has some spotting), doesn't have the hairs on the callus ridges or labellum like Mike's plant. They are one of the key features that make me suspect Rosefieldense. *Cym. hookerianum*'s hairs (when present) are usually confined to the edges of the sidelobes and/or are very short ones on the callus ridges. The lip spotting on Mike's plant is also inconsistent with *hookerianum*.



At left is a hookerianum "Drouin" which was shown at a major Victorian Cymbidium show some years back It is accepted that this is a genuine hookerianum.

Many plants grown as hookerianum are in fact seedlings bred from hookerianum and owners are unaware that they are incorrectly named. Sorry Mike.




On Wednesday 24th August 2022, starting at 8.00pm Beginners meet on the stage at front of hall from 7.15pm
